
WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN?


A Comprehensive Plan is a **guidance document that sets goals, policies, and priorities** for investing in the physical, economic, and environmental future of the Town.

A Comprehensive Plan also helps **improve the success of grant applications** and provides a **basis for updating zoning** regulations.

A Comprehensive Plan includes an **inventory of existing conditions**, identifies **opportunities & challenges**, & articulates residents' **desire for the future** of the community.

The Town's last Comprehensive (Master) Plan was adopted in 1977.

In September 2023, the Town of Schroon initiated the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan. A Project Advisory Committee was appointed by the Town Board to gulde the development of a new Town Comprehensive Plan. The Committee represents individuals from a wide cross section of the community. Planning consultant LaBella Associates will be guiding the planning process to update the 1977 Town of Schroon Master Plan. Much has changed over the past 46 years. The new Comprehensive Plan will provide a framework for achieving a community vision that is reflective of the current community conditions and builds on the progress that has been made to date.


What is a Comprehensive Plan?

A Comprehensive Plan is a guidance document that sets goals, policies, and prioritiles for investing in the physical, economic, and environmental future of the Town. The Comprehensive Plan is both a vision for the future and a roadmap for how to achieve the vision. It provides the Town Board with direction for making decisions about improvements to town infrastructure, revising zoning regulations, allocating resources in the annual budget, and supporting grant applications for high priority projects. A broad range of topics are addressed in the Comprehensive Plan, including but not limited to economic development, tourism, housing, climate change, infrastructure, land use, natural resources, recreation, and community services.
